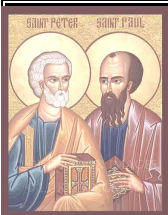

Sunday of the Prodigal Son



For this my son was
dead and is alive
again; he was lost and
is found.

Luke 15:24

This week the Church gives us an example of repentance, forgiveness and mercy to help us prepare for the Great Fast. Everyone knows this beloved story which speaks to each soul who hears it.

Perhaps we identify with the younger son who has let sin keep him far from the Father's love. Like this son, we search and search; trying to fill ourselves up with things that leave us empty. Finally, in our misery, we realize that this emptiness can be filled only in the loving arms of the Father. With sorrow in our hearts and a desire for a fresh start, we return in humility to ask forgiveness. This happens again and again in our lives and each time the Father is waiting with open arms, not to restore us to where we were before, but to lift us even higher with His merciful love.

The story of the Prodigal Son not only reveals the compassionate love of the Father welcoming the Prodigal home; it also shows the elder son. The elder son resents the Father's welcoming the Prodigal home. The elder son has been faithful and obedient and yet, the Father seems to lavish more love and more attention on the disobedient son. Perhaps we identify with the older brother, with his jealousy and his reluctance to forgive or to rejoice over the return of his brother. The Father opens his heart to this son also. The son is assured that he has a place in the Father's heart as well and is invited to share in the Father's joy over the return of the lost.

We are also like the elder son in the story when we judge God's compassionate love of the sinners of the world – the prostitutes, the drug addicts, the drunks, the homeless, the unemployed. How could God love them when I work so hard and am so faithful? Part of this Sunday's reflection includes acknowledging our self-righteousness and how it keeps us from receiving God's loving forgiveness.

This parable is called the Prodigal Son but it could just as easily be called the parable of the Loving Father. We must realize that no matter how far we go away from God, the Loving Father is always waiting to welcome us home. We are the Beloved of God and we can rely on the mercy of God. We need only acknowledge our sinfulness before God and ask forgiveness.

This Parable can also be called the Tale of Two Brothers both of whom had hardened their hearts to their Father. One had simply run and the other had simply stayed. Both had lost the intimate relationship with the Father. Both had lost the understanding and revelation of son ship.

Every single person is one or the other of these brothers – either we harden our hearts and run from our Heavenly Father and return with such a perspective of ourselves that we return as less than a son or daughter of the Most High – for the younger brother returned to be a servant in his father's home. Or we harden our hearts to the Heavenly Father and stay within His home – serving and working for Him in such a manner that it all looks and sounds good, but again, the revelation of who we are to our Father is missing.

The saddest part of this story is that it appears that the older brother was a lot slower to coming to any understanding of son ship and having a softened heart, which sadly seems to be the case for many of us who have remained in the Father's house for a long time and become habitual servers of Him, out of duty, without the love relationship!

At this time in your life, which brother are you? It is time for us to pray for a fresh perspective of our love relationship with our Father – it is time for us to begin to behave and act and respond as sons and daughters of the Most High!
