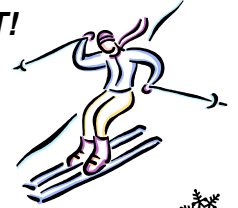

The Sunday of the Publican and the Pharisee

As we move into the Pre-Lenten Season, the Church sets out examples of repentance and conversion. This season is a time of invitation and preparation. Any athlete will prepare physically and psychologically for the challenges they face in his sport. We must warm up our spiritual muscles before we attempt the challenge we face in our spiritual lives ó the Great Fast. We are invited to a conversion, not just on the outside with physical discipline, but on the inside, deep within the heart.



Last Sunday, Zaccheus inspired us with his desire to see Jesus. We were challenged òto come down from the tree and leave all our pride and worries behind. This Sunday the Publican and the Pharisee teach us about the ugliness of pride and the importance of humility. Publicans were tax collectors known for their dishonesty and were hated by all. Pharisees were a religious group concerned with following the Mosaic Law, sometimes forgetting to practice the virtues that inspired it. The Pharisee goes to the temple and stands to pray. He probably is a good man, but doesn't realize that his goodness has nothing to do with him at all, and has everything to do with God's grace. The Publican does not even raise his eyes in the temple and begs for God's mercy, realizing that the only thing he can take credit for in his life are his sins. Here we see two extremes: a very obedient, very pious man who is not in right relationship with God, and a sinner who knows who he is, admits it, and is in right relationship with God. The Pharisee is aware of his accomplishments and but not God's grace. The Publican is aware of his failings and his need for God's grace.

This is our invitation to leave our prideful selves behind and take on inner humility. If we carry our pride on this journey of Lent, we will not be aware of our failings and our need for God's grace. Without this awareness, we can not experience that great conversion of the heart that will lead us into a deeper relationship with God. The week following this Sunday is a privileged week. We are allowed to eat meat even on Friday. This reinforces the lesson of the Publican and the Pharisee that inner humility shows God a truer heart than outward signs that are empty and lead to pride.

THE PRESENTATION OF OUR LORD



On this Feast day, we see Jesus forty days old, carried into the temple in Jerusalem by Mary and Joseph, to be recognized as God's Messiah by the aged Simeon and Anna.

In obedience to the Law of Moses, the Lord Jesus, the first-born, was presented in the Temple by his Blessed Mother and his foster father. Joseph and Mary brought the Child Jesus into the temple along with a humble sacrifice of young pigeons as a sign of thanksgiving.

In Jerusalem at that time there lived a man, Simeon, who was just and devout. According to tradition, Simeon had been visited by an angel of the Lord who foretold him that he would not see death before seeing the Messiah born of the Virgin. Led by the Holy Spirit into the temple on the day that the holy family brought the Child Jesus to fulfill the law, Simeon took the Child into his arms and blessed God by saying: "Lord, now let Your servant depart in peace, according to Your word; for my eyes have seen Your salvation, which You have prepared before the face of all people, a light to lighten the gentiles, and the glory of Thy people Israel" (Luke 2:29-32). This is another 'epiphany' celebration insofar as the Christ Child is revealed as the Messiah through the canticle and words of Simeon and the testimony of Anna the prophetess who was also in the temple that day. Christ is the light of the nations, hence the blessing of candles on this day.
